## How to Join...

Membership is open to any organization, business, agency, nonprofit, individual that supports the vision, mission, purpose and principles of NCRHLA. Membership is broadly defined to promote greater participation and inclusiveness.

Annual dues are for a calendar year (Jan. 1 – Dec. 31). A hardship provision is available if unable to pay the full membership dues.

<b>Organization \$200</b>	Open to any organization, business, agency, or nonprofit that supports the vision, mission, purpose and principles of NCRHLA. Organizational members may vote at membership meetings, serve as a member of the Steering Committee, and serve on workgroups.
<b>Individual \$50</b>	Open to any person interested in rural health or rural health care issues. Individual members may vote at membership meetings, serve as a member of the Steering Committee, and serve on workgroups.
<b>Retired \$20</b>	Any retired person interested in rural health or rural health care issues. Retired members may vote at membership meetings, serve as a member of the Steering Committee, and serve on workgroup.
<b>Student \$20</b>	Any full-time student with an interest in rural health or rural health care issues. Student members may vote at membership meetings, serve as a member of the Steering Committee, and serve on workgroup.
