How do we Work?

NCRHA promotes collaboration by connecting and convening on matters of health, coordinated forums, and work groups to address and foster collaborative rural health solutions.

Our Work Groups

Health Equity

Provides advice, guidance and recommendations that will address and advance health equity in underserved, high-risk communities. This includes convening rural allies by creating social and physical environments that promote good health for all in rural

Behavioral Health

Convenes individuals and organizations working in the behavioral health space including substance abuse/misuse. This group gives special focus to access, quality, affordability, co-occurrence, and social stressors.

Rural Coalition Fighting COVID-19

Examines existing data on vaccination rates and social vulnerability areas. Also provides input on gaps in rural health engagement regarding population health and identifies strategies for bridging these gaps.

Policy and Legislation

Champions health issues affecting rural communities and monitors actions of the NC General Assembly as they pertain to rural health in our state. This includes assisting staff with development of a legislative agenda each year.





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
